


State Solutions to a National Problem

It's been **four years** since the last increase in the federal minimum wage, to **\$7.25 per hour**, or **\$15,000 per year** for full-time work. However, **19 states have raised theirs above the federal level**, and 10 of them decided to make their state minimum wages automatically keep pace with inflation, something that federal level doesn't do.



There's an even lower minimum wage for **tipped workers**. The federal minimum for these workers (such as waitstaff, hair stylists and car washers) is only **\$2.13 an hour**, a level that hasn't been increased in 21 years. However, **31 states have higher minimum wages for tipped workers**, and seven have set the tipped worker minimum at the same level as that for non-tipped workers.
